

urn in your Bibles to Revelation chapter two. I hope you have your Bible with you and will look on with us. How many in this building are believers in Christ? Amen. That is wonderful!

Now that I know you are a believer, I am going to talk to the believers. In these verses that I am going to read, you are going to see the **believers' assignment** and the **believers' anticipation**.

Look at verse 24 of chapter 2 of Revelation: "But unto you I say, and unto the rest in Thyatira, as many as have not this doctrine, and which have not known the depths of Satan, as they speak; I will put upon you none other burden."

So, he is talking to you and me individually from this passage. You have to read the Bible as God talking to you. Sure, there are books and portions that talk to Israel, but if you will listen, He will be talking to you too.

Look at it again, "But unto you I say. . . ." This little one letter word "I" is reaching back to verse number 18, (Rev. 2:18),

"And unto the angel of the church in Thyatira write; These things saith the Son of God, who hath his eyes like unto a flame of fire, and his feet are like fine brass."

Notice "These things saith the Son of God," so the One Who is talking to us here is the Son of God. He is speaking to us from His Word.

Now, look with me at the last five words of verse 25 (Rev. 2:25), "But that which ye have already hold fast till I come."

In those five words we have the believers' assignment and the believers' anticipation. God is speaking to the godly remnant who are in this church at Thyatira who had not been infected with the virus of Jezebel. (Now, if you have been infected, that is different.) He is saying to you and me, "HOLD FAST TILL I COME." In this phrase God is saying, "I have an important message for you. It would be well for you to learn this." In the Christian life, you need to learn a lot of good things. Here He has an important lesson for you to learn. He said, "You must not be driven by the

new way of life. You must not traffic with Jezebel." We are living in a time when everything spiritual is relaxed. It is a time of coldness. There is a stampede of those who are rushing us away from the fundamentals of this Book, and it is a lax time. But God is saying to you and me, "You must not move from the standards that I have given you." You see, sometimes, we get it in our mind that we should listen to what they are saying. We think they could give us some life instructions. They are changing our conduct.

God says, "You must not be measured by their standards." God said here, "Hold fast till I come."

What does He want you to hold fast to? You hold fast to what you already have. You can't hold it, if you don't have it. What is it that you already have? You have the WORD OF GOD.

Some so-called fundamental, Bible-believing churches are saying things that didn't come out of this Book. They want to make you look like a fool if you stay with the Book, but I am going to tell you what God said. It is clearly recorded right here, "Hold fast."

Your assignment is to HOLD FAST. You see, 2019 is nearly over, but we are facing 2020. In 2020, we need more who will stand up and hold fast to what God has given us.

Paul said to the church at Thessalonica (2 Thessalonians 2:15): "Therefore, brethren, stand fast, and hold the traditions which ye have been taught, whether by word, or our epistle." Paul said, I gave you a book. Stay IN it and you will stay WITH it. It is when you are not staying in it that you want to drift away from it. You have the HOLY WORD OF GOD-HOLD FAST!

Our assignment is to hold fast. What in the world is that? It is an attitude of **consistency**.

You hold fast to what you already have. You can't hold it, if you don't have it. What is it that you already have? You have the WORD OF GOD. You don't have to stop being sweet just because you stay strong.

Consistency—we should think consistently and stay by the stuff. To hold fast, to be consistent, is to be steadfast. It is to be continuous. It is unswerving affection for the things that God has given us in this blessed Book, the Word of God. It is spiritual consistency in the things of God.

Listen to Job way back yonder. They tell me that Job is the oldest book in the Bible, and in chapter 23, verse 11, Job said, "My foot hath held his steps, his way have I kept, and not declined."

Job said, "I did not waiver. My foot held fast to the path." You see, what he is telling you and me is this, Don't be wishywashy. Stay by the stuff.


You don't have to stop being sweet just because you stay strong. I know (I am an Independent, and I hang around with Independents) that there is a crowd who thinks you have to be ugly to be right. That is not right.

Do you know anybody who was more fundamental than Jesus? Do you know anybody sweeter? That is why we sing, "Jesus is the sweetest name I know." The next line says, "and He's just the same as His lovely name, and that's the reason why I love Him so."

Be consistent. Stay with it. That is your assignment for 2020. Of course, it never has changed, and when 2021 comes, it will still be the same.

Not only does HOLD FAST imply an attitude of consistency but an attitude of **confidence**. Hebrews 3:6, "... if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the end."

Hold onto your confidence in the Lord Jesus Christ. "For I know whom I have believed" (2 Tim. 1:2). You see it is a Person in whom we believe. Sure, we believe the Bible, but God gave us the Bible to believe in Him. He gave us the written

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Word so we would believe the Living Word. Isn't that right? Thank God for this Book, absolutely, but believing this Book won't save you. Now, listen to me closely, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved" (Acts 16:31).

I was watching yesterday one of the Moody Bible Institute of Science films on creation and planets. They were moving through all these planets. They go out there where they say it is 10 billion light years away, and there are still planets and galaxies everywhere.

Your God ain't no peewee! He is bigger than your mind can think, but He is not bigger than your faith can experience.

He said your assignment is to hold fast your consistency, your confidence, and your **courage**. God does not want weaklings.

How do you get strength? Get in the Book. Absolutely, this Book will make you strong in the Lord when you trust in this blessed Book which God has given us. "Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of the Lord," but "Hold fast the form of sound words," "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong." Have courage in your active faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

You see, this is not a little assignment, oh, absolutely not. Hold fast with consistency, confidence, courage, and **consecration**.

Consecration is allegiance to Almighty God. I am consecrated. I am absolutely separated **TO** God. He saved me. I am His because He bought me. He redeemed me by His precious blood. Oh, that is wonderful. I am His. He purchased me. Oh, wait a minute, also I am His because I gave myself to Him. Did you hear what I said? You see, I can say with the Psalmist, I am His and He is mine. He is mine because He gave Himself for me and to me. I am His because I have given myself to Him.

You say, "But I am saved." Yes, you may be saved but many professing Christians have never given their life to Christ. They are wasting it on the things of the world.

The Bible says in Ephesians 5:11: "And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them." In other words, we must be consecrated, sold out to God. Don't let go of what is right.

Flee temptation and don't leave a forwarding address.

God gives us three channels by which all of this can become a reality in our heart and life. I want to give them to you, because God never asks you to do something that He does not give you the means with which to do it.

First of all, this can be accomplished by the continual reading of the Word of God. II Timothy 3:14-17, "But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ *Jesus. All scripture is given by* inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works."

The word "that" in the last sentence denotes purpose. He said I gave you the Holy Scriptures that the man of God (That is every born-again believer. I know you are not a preacher, as such, but you are a man of God.) would be perfect (complete), throughly (thoroughly) furnished unto all good works.


How do you do that? You get in the Scriptures continually reading the Word of God. When I say continually, I don't mean start at 8:00 AM in the morning and read continually until 8:00 AM the next morning. That is not what it means. You read some today, and read some tomorrow, and some more again the next day and the next day, and so on. Just read it daily taking it into your heart and your life. It is like praying without ceasing. He did not say pray without stopping. He said pray this morning, pray this afternoon, pray tomorrow, pray in the night, pray in the morning-just continually pray. Here is My purpose: that you may be throughly furnished unto all good works.

What are you going to complain about if He has already given you everything you need? Amen. I mean if you have an automatic rifle and a deer is standing in front of you, all

You see, when you get in the Book, you will get down on your knees. It just naturally follows. It goes together.

you have to do is pull the trigger. Well, you had better aim and then pull the trigger.

Please listen. God Almighty has told us what He wants us to do and has put it all right here in this Bible for you and me. All you have to do is live it. We should continually read the Word of God.

Secondly, we need to constantly resort to the throne of grace. "Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need," Hebrews 4:16.

You see, when you get in the Book, you will get down on your knees. It just naturally follows. It goes together.

He said resort constantly to the throne of grace. You don't have the strength to do it, but God has grace, something you don't deserve, and He will give it to you so that you may hold fast.

Thirdly, we need to **rely completely** upon the Holy Spirit. He said, "... be filled with the Spirit," Ephesians 5:18b. To be filled with the Spirit is to be controlled by the Spirit. Paul preaching to the church at Ephesus (Eph. 3:16) says, "That he would grant you . . . to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man." We are strengthened with His glorious power through the Holy Spirit. Acts 1:8, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth."

When God Almighty fills us with His power we can carry out our assignment, and our assignment is to hold fast.

Now then, from the last five words of Rev. 2:25, we have looked at the believers' assignment-HOLD FAST. Quickly let me give you the believers' anticipation. He said HOLD

FAST TILL I COME. Anticipation is something looked for. It is something expected beforehand. Anticipation is something you enjoy while you are waiting for it to come to pass.

I don't know about you, but when I got saved, I got thrilled about the fact that the Lord is coming again, and right now I am enjoying it. You see, I don't have to wait to enjoy it. I am anticipating it.

I remember as a baby playing in the front yard after the Government had sent Mama a letter telling her that Daddy was coming home from WWII. We lived in the country on a dirt road. You could sit on the front porch and look up or down the road for a long way. Mama was running out the door every so often looking up and down the road. She was anticipating her lover coming home. Those children that she had been caring for and wiping their dirty noses were his babies as well as hers, and she could not wait until he got home.

When God saved me, He put the realization of the coming again of the Lord Jesus in my heart, and I am enjoying it. Notice the **Person expected**. He said in I Thessalonians 1:10, "And to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, even Jesus, which delivered us from the wrath to come."

He said "to wait for His Son." He is no substitute. The Person Who saved me is the Person Who is coming. Occasionally, (I wish it was all the time), I get alone in my study on my face before God, and God gets so real, I just want to see Him right then. He didn't say, "You wait, and I'll send Gabriel to get you." No, the Person Who is coming is the only begotten Son of God. Paul said to the Philippians in Phil. 3:20, "For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ."

The Lord Jesus Christ, He is the one I am looking for. Yes, I am looking for Him because of our gathering together unto Him. We are all going to get together and meet Him. I know God knows everything, and He knows the longing you have. There is no doubt in my mind that Dr. Moore would love to see Sister Nellie. Don't you think Cindy would not love to see her Mama?

Please listen to me. I don't understand it all, but in the rapture, they (the dead in Christ) are going to rise first, and we are going to be caught up with them. There is going to be a family reunion before you meet Him in the air. Are you still listening? You see God understands us. He made us. He became one of us so He could understand us.

He said "to wait for His Son." He is no substitute. The Person Who saved me is the Person Who is coming.

I have talked about the Person expected. Now look at the **prospect anticipated**. The prospect is the coming of the Lord. Would you look at His **positive declaration?** "I will come again," John 14:3. Very positive, there is no doubt about it. Not only is it positive, it is **purifying**. 1 John 3:3, "And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure."

I wonder if we really believe that. How many of you believe that when you got saved, you got eternal life? Amen. Alright, what you got was God's life. Eternal life is the life of an eternal God. John 10:28, "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand."

"And I give unto them eternal life. . . ." The eternal life I am going to have there I have right now, so why am I not living right now like I am going to live when I get there? The prospect of His coming is positive, and purifying, and personal.

Colossians 3:4, "When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory." Notice, "then shall ye also appear with Him in glory." God never does anything for you that is not personal. Are you listening to me? If He answers your prayer, it is personal between God and you. If He protects you, it is personal between God and you.

God, in this service this morning, is meeting individual needs. My needs are different from your needs. God is so personal. He understands your frame of mind.

In the believers' anticipation, we have seen the Person expected, and the prospect anticipated. Now see the **purpose fulfilled**. When He comes, He is going to receive His own and reward His own. In John 14:3, "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also."

The believers' anticipation is an **expectation** that causes us to look. Are you looking for the Saviour today? Just as expectation causes me to look, **devotion** causes me to live holy. Listen to Paul in Titus 2:12-13, "Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ."

You are not going to like this word either—it is called *labor*. You say, "Where did you get that word?" Luke's Gospel (19:13b), "Occupy till I come." Usually people think work is a four-letter, bad word, and they shun it. But listen, when there is **occupation**, it is because we are laboring in the field for the glory of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Expectation, dedication, occupation, infatuation. Wouldn't it be awesome if our desire became so fervent, so inspired with intense love for our Saviour that we loved His appearing? II Timothy 4:8, "Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me

only, but unto all them also that love his appearing."

Expectation, you look. Devotion, you live. Occupation, you labor. Infatuation, you love.

Isn't that awesome? I am talking about anticipation, with a yearning in my heart, I cry out, "Even so, come, Lord Jesus."

The believers' assignment—hold fast.

The believers' anticipation—till I come.

In this life, we must hold to the things God has given us because the devil will do everything in his power to steal them away. When Jesus comes, that will be over. There won't be anything else tempting us. We are going to be called out of this world into the presence of Almighty God where sin cannot enter. All you have to do is to hold fast till He comes. You are not holding fast for your salvation. You are holding fast for your sanctification that we might stay steady in the fight for Christ.

We are born again of incorruptible seed by the Word of God which liveth and abideth forever. 1 Peter 1:23, "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."

If you don't know this Christ, you can get saved by believing what this Book tells you. This Book says, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved." The Book says, "But as many as received him, to them (and to nobody else,) gave he power (the right) to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name."

Maybe you have become lax like the church in Thyatira. Maybe you have been infected with Jezebel. Why don't you come and get a dose of the medicine of God and let the blood wash away the stain? God will do it today.

I know the kids were always around and involved in the ministry. Peter was a rambunctious 4-year-old who stole our hearts. Over the years, all of Sue's children became dear to us. I can

hardly believe that was 45 years ago, and we are still involved in the ministry together and have been throughout these 45 years.

Sue came to Shiloh because her friend and neighbor, Gail Burnsed, asked Preacher Moore to visit Sue and help her tell her children about their father. The Bible talks about fruit that remains, and we all fit that description by the grace of God and to His glory. 



God always has a succession plan. Throughout the generations we see His sovereign will where one leader takes over the job of another. 
"Others" is her motto. "Others, Lord, yes, others, let this my motto be. Help me live for


others that I may live like Thee." Sue fulfills this motto well.

Search the Scriptures

John 5:39, "Search the scriptures . . . they are they that testify of me."

You search, investigate, and pour over the Scripture diligently because these very Scriptures testify of Me. Paul's determination was Philippians 3:10, "That I may know him," become more deeply and intimately acquainted with Him. Paul wanted a greater insight into His Person. John tells us explicitly that such knowledge comes from the Scriptures. In the Scriptures...



I. The Heart of Christ Is Described.

Matt. 11:29, "... learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart..." Jesus describing His heart said, "I am meek and lowly." Mystery, yes, mystery that Divine Majesty is shining forth its splendor from the setting of Divine Meekness.

- A. The Model of Meekness, "I am meek." The word used for meek in this passage is said to be used only once in Scripture. How significant! There is but one model of meekness for humanity.
- B. The Measure of Lowliness, "I am . . . lowly." Who said, "I am lowly"? None other than the "high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy," Is. 57:15, yet, He stooped low to the abode of humanity. His birth was lowly—a lowly cattle shed. His blood shedding was lowly to redeem the lost. Our lowly Lord stoops even to "the death of the cross," Phil. 2:8. These truths mirror His heart.

The word used for meek in this passage is said to be used only once in Scripture. How significant! There is but one model of meekness for humanity.

II. The Will of Christ Is Declared.

John 17:24a, "Father, I will that they also, whom thou hast given me, be with me where I am, that they may behold my glory." For the first time in this prayer, Christ says, "I will." It expresses desire. The will of Christ for His people includes two things.

- A. Coexistence with Christ, vs. 24, "be with me where I am." Christ coexists with the church now, Matt. 28:20b, then the church will coexist with Christ. I Thess. 4:17, ". . . and so shall we ever be with the Lord."
- B. Contemplation of Christ, vs. 24, "that they may behold my glory." "Behold" is to hold in view His most exalted state, splendor, preeminence, and majesty for "we shall see him as he is," 1 John 3:2. In the Scriptures, the will of Christ is declared.

III. The Mind of Christ Is Disclosed.

Phil. 2:5, "Let this mind . . . which was also in Christ Jesus." This mind includes His thinking and attitude. "This mind" "humbled himself." It was voluntary. He went the limit of humiliation. He went from the highest in Heaven to the lowest on earth, from the Sovereign of all to the Servant of all, from the Crown of Glory to the Cross of Golgotha. The mind of Christ is disclosed in Scripture.

IV. The Love of Christ Is Displayed.

1 John 3:16a, "Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us." "Hereby," by this we perceive love. "He laid down his life for us," this is the display of love. Actions speak louder than words. This is how we know what love is. Jesus Christ laid down His life for us. Calvary is the supreme display of love. It crowns all! We need look no further than Calvary for genuine, authentic, original love.
