you will turn to I Peter, I will read some verses from chapter 2. Because it reinforces what I want to say throughout the whole service, I want to read 1 Peter 2:5. Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ.

Then let's read 1 Peter 2:9-10: But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light: Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy. May the Lord bless the reading of His Word.

By way of introduction, I want to say it like this. I understand that this is a church, but this is more than a church. It is the called-out people of God. That is what the Bible says. The Bible says we are a holy people. The Bible says, also, in Peter's writing that we are a royal priesthood.

Now, this is the writing of a man. Some call him the first Pope, but he denies that. He does not agree to that. He says, the company is a meeting of priests. This meeting is a company of priests. If you read the Scriptures about the priest, you will see, in one particular place, that the father of John the Baptist was a priest, and he executed the office of the priest before the Lord. So, priests can come before the Lord. They have special access to God. They are chosen because they are called and respond to the call.

Somebody said, "How do they get elected?"

Well, they respond to the call. Read the Bible. Look in John 1:11-12: *He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name.*

Now, in my early years, I did not understand the priesthood of the believer, because we did not go to church regularly until after I was ten years old. We would go to the church, but the preacher did not come They would begin by singing some hymns. Then a dear, old sister would get up and testify. My, she would have God all over her!

Boys out of our community began to be called to fight, and those dear mothers would stand up and testify under the power of God. but once a month. Some of the churches did not even have Sunday school. When they had church, they would have it nearly all day. They would begin by singing some hymns. Then a dear, old sister would get up and testify. My, she would have God all over her! The preacher would have a hard time coming up to that level himself.

I didn't know what that was about. I learned a little bit more after I got saved. I was saved the first Sunday in May of 1941.

Japan bombed Pearl Harbor the 7th day of December that year. Boys out of our community began to be called to fight, and those dear mothers would stand up and testify under the power of God. You just knew in your heart that their boys were going to be alright.

Preacher Fields would call on Sister O'Kelly to pray. She would get down on her knees and start praying. She would call out her son's name, George Robert. I can remember it just like it was yesterday. She would say, "Oh, God, wherever George Robert is right now, guide those bullets away from him." From deep down in your soul, you would feel your own prayer saying, "God, don't dare let a bullet hit him."

You are priests. You have access to God. I have found that some of the men are not as spiritual as the ladies. Can I get an "Amen" there? I have pastored a lot of ladies, sisters, who seemed like they were closer to God than I was, and I was the pastor. Thank God for a company of priests who can get hold of God.

I want to give a little outline. I must make notes for myself now. I used to make fun of preachers who made notes, but my memory is not as good now as it used to be. I will go into a room to get my cell phone, and before I get to it, I will pick up my hat and go out the door. So, I have some notes now.

AWESOME PRIVILEGE

This sermon is burning in my heart. The first thing I want to cover is the awesomeness of being a priest and the fact that you can stand before God on your own behalf and on the behalf of others.

I love my church, and I can feel God when I meet with you. I can feel God at home on my knees in the middle of the night just like I can here. I am glad I don't have to get up and go to the cathedral or the church. If I am in my home, I can talk to God from there, or I can talk to Him while walking around out in the yard.

It is an awesome thing to think about approaching the God of the universe. The One Whose hands are beyond the stars can touch you.

George Beverly Shea used to say, "I walk out to the ocean and look to the horizon, but I know out there is more. There is more. I can look up at the stars and know there is more. I can feel His presence in my heart and know there is more." What an awesome thing to stand before God. You should not take it for granted. If you take it for granted, you will lose it.

I must admit that although I am a born-again child of God, I am not always in touch with my Father. Sometimes I am closer than at other times. I am just being honest. It is awesome to come before our awesome God.

Another responsibility comes with our privilege of going before our Holy God, but we might not like. Jesus said in Matthew 5:44, *But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you....* Now, you are going to have to be spiritual to do that. Amen? You say, "Well, I don't have any enemies."

Well, then, you are not amounting to anything.

B. R. Lakin said, "I will tell you, boys, how to not have any enemies or any criticism, don't do anything, don't have anything, and don't be anything."

If you don't have any enemies, you are not doing anything. If the devil is not after you, he knows you are doing nothing.

I get tickled and blessed at the same time at Sue when she is having a hard time in the office. She will say, "The devil hates me!"

She is absolutely right. He always hates us. He hates all of God's children. It is an awesome responsibility to go to God for others.

It is an awesome responsibility to be a parent. We need to let some Americans know that. When you bring a child into the world, whether you are the father or the mother, you have a responsibility.



I was the pastor there in 1948 and stayed four years. The church was not very old, 25 or 30 years old, when I went there. I was 18 and turned 19 the following February. We saw a revival that changed the church and the community.

My Life's Convictions

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Nellie, "We are not going to have church," but they would get up the next morning like nothing had every happened. It was normal to them to argue and fuss.

I got up early that morning, and I left the house by myself while Nellie was taking care of little June. I went down a long pasture lane hunting a place to pray. Just as I passed the barn, I heard somebody talking. I started looking around. I thought, "Surely I am not hearing things." There in a ditch by the pasture lane, I could see the top of Roy's head. He was talking to the Lord.

I walked on down a little bit further. Over on a hill, I heard Love Stowe praying and, boy, I tell you what, he was letting it roll.

I walked on down a little further still hunting a quiet place for me to pray. Well, there was Brother Mohon, and he was praying.

All these folks praying made my hair stand up. I finally found a place to pray and, sure enough, that Sunday morning it busted

loose. We had revival. Of course, we had a little problem, but I won't go into that. God settled it. What I am saying is there is a great reward for coming before the Lord in humility and trust.

I have talked to a lot of people in my life (whether in business or other ways) who have made statements that proved untrue down the road. Early on I learned that they may mean what they are saying now, but things could change, and sometimes they did. I never went before my Lord and got an answer from Him that ever changed. It always worked out just like He said. Every time I went to Him and asked Him anything, when I got the answer, it was a good answer. Sometimes it was "No," but that was a good answer for that particular thing.

I learned this from Brother Sammy Bryant who was a member of my first church. He had already retired from the pastorate. One day he said to me, "Brother Tolbert, you have become popular. They are wanting you everywhere. In the coming days, you may see a church and think, "Oh, I would like to be a preacher there." You may see some other wonderful-looking church, and you will think, "Boy, that would be a great church to preach in. Lord, when preachercalling time comes, please let them call me!" Then preacher calling will come, and they won't call you. Six months later, you will be saying, "God, thank You, for not sending me there. Thank You, Lord, You didn't answer my prayer."

Listen, I want spiritual results. The Bible says we have a spiritual house. Well, this house is wooden. Let's read 1 Peter 2:5 again, Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ. Peter also tells us this in 2 Peter 3:9, The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.

Now, wait a minute. He is not just talking about me. He is not willing that *any* should perish. The old Primitive Baptist would say, "That must be a misprint there because if God is not willing for any to perish then no one *would* perish." Spurgeon said, "What he meant is that He is not *wishing* for anyone to perish."

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I will go with Spurgeon, won't you? I don't believe that God has foreordained or predestined that some *cannot* get saved because the Bible says, For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.

I don't have time to tell all my experience. Like I said, we did not go to church regularly until I was ten years old. My dad had met the Lord when he was 13 years old, but he got away from the Lord. That is what he said. He drank, and they made music for the square dances. They were talented. Dad played the banjo. Mom would play a guitar or the accordion. Uncle Frank would play a guitar, and sometimes Granddaddy would play the violin. They would take us along, and I would sit over to the side.

When we started going to church regularly, all the churches we attended only had preaching on one Sunday a month. Pleasant Grove, that is where I was saved, had their service on the first Sunday. Ozora was on the second Sunday. Bay Creek was on the third Sunday, and Bethel at Stone Mountain was on the fourth Sunday. So, the preachers would preach a long time, and it seemed like they preached the whole Bible. Most of the preachers would preach out of the Old Testament, but occasionally, they would say something about being saved.

A visiting preacher came one time, and they put him up to preach. He preached on Hell, and that scared me out of my wits. From that time on, every time I prayed I would tell the Lord that I did not want to go to Hell.

I tried every which way to get saved. I would ask my mother, "Mama, how will I know I am saved?" She would say, "You will know." "Well, how do I get saved?"

"You just get saved." They were not taught soul winning.

The first Sunday in May of 1941, I was sitting on the front bench of the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church. Preacher Sword's sons (Donald and Gilbert) sat one on each side of me. I was in the middle. Preacher Sword would preach at all four churches, and during Easter, he would preach on the Resurrection. He had on a double-breasted, navy, striped suit. He preached a sermon on doubting Thomas. He came to that part in John 20:27 that says, Then saith he to Thomas, Reach *hither thy finger, and behold my hands*; *and reach hither thy* hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing.

At that moment, I never will forget it, I got a glimpse of a Resurrected Saviour, and He just came into my heart. I wasn't even praying right then. I was just open to that Word, and it came in, and I have never had a serious doubt about my salvation since then, and that will soon be 76 years ago!

Before that morning, I had prayed to be saved, and that morning my prayer was answered. I never did understand it, to be honest with you. I don't even understand it now. I just know it happened. I know it is real. I know when

the Holy Spirit is working in my heart and in my life. I know when He is dealing with me. I know the best rewards of my life have come through prayer.

To be able to pray and to be a priest is the best gift God can give you. Whether you are a lady or a man, you can touch God as well as any preacher can. What wonderful results! They are awesome.

If you are not saved, then that means you are not a priest. Several people here have been praying for you to be saved. How many of you have been praying for the lost people to be saved? See there, lost people. You have already been prayed for by a lot of people. They are praying, and they are getting through on your behalf. If you call on Him, you will get through too.

I will be 88 years old if I live until next Friday, February 3. I have been saved since I was 12. I have walked with Him on this long journey, and yet it seems like just a few days have passed, but I am getting closer Home. I have traveled a lot of miles on this journey, but I have never traveled one foot when He was not with me. I thank you for praying for me as I preached. I want you to pray for our church, our community, our nation, and our leaders. I love our nation, and I love you, and God loves you. 🕆

When we open the Word of God, we should be conscious of His divine presence. He stands by us as we read-He stirs our hearts-and as the King of kings marches on, we march with Him.

With the Apostle Paul, Christ was in the very center of his life, his theology, and his preaching. No wonder he could say, "Christ liveth in me."

Every message given by Paul was a message about Christ. With truthfulness he could say, "We preach Christ crucified." He knew that this was the only preaching that God blesses, and he knew that this was the only preaching which would meet the needs of lost mankind.

The main message of the minister of the Gospel is Christ. Yes, we are to preach about God and the Holy Spirit, but Christ is the message for this world. God the Father is seeking by every means to point men to the Lamb of God. The Holy Spirit speaks not of Himself, but of Christ. He came into the world

to convict men of their unbelief, to guide them into truth, and to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ.

This world is filled with preaching. There is an abundance of it from radio, television, the newspapers, magazines, and pulpits. Some of it is good and some of it is evil. Some of it glorifies Christ and some of it glorifies the Devil. Some of it is serious and some of it is silly. Some preaching is simply an excuse for a man to seek to bring glory to himself. He mentions the name of God, of Christ, and of the Holy Spirit, but in such a way that attention is drawn to his own personality.

For this message I want you to see Christ in three different ways.

See Him as King of the Spheres

The march of Christ is forward toward His throne. He came into the world, born of a virgin, and walked among

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men. He was the greatest man who ever walked upon this earth, but He could not remain with men in physical presence. He was going toward the throne.

They nailed Him to a cross, but the cross could not hold Him, for He must go on to His throne. He was placed in a rock tomb, sealed by the Roman governor, but that tomb could not hold Him, for He was marching toward His throne.

Christ is seated today at the right hand of the Heavenly Father, but He will not stay there, for He is coming back to this earth to sit on His throne. The world, yes, all worlds, will one day bow before Him as Philippians 2:9-11 says.

There are many things that we will never see accomplished in this world. We will not see all men won to Christ, for millions will die without Christ and without hope. We will not see the world cleaned up in this age. Reform



movements are noble energies of the flesh, but discouraging, for man is sinful and loves sin more than he loves purity and light. But we will see one glorious day the crowning of Jesus, the King of kings and the Lord of lords. In that hour we will have the realization of all of our dreams as we face our Master.

Let Christ be the King of your life now. This will mean a surrender of all you have and hope to be unto Him.


Let Christ the King show Himself in your daily life. Let others see that you are walking and talking with the Lord by your Bible reading, your prayer, and your worship. Let men know that you are on the side of the Lord by your consecrated walk and by your refusal to engage in things of sin. Give your obedience to Christ the King in every way. Do what the blessed Lord commands you to do. Let Christ be King of your life.

See Him as Key and King of the Scriptures

Christ is the Key that unlocks the inspired Word of God. Without Christ we cannot understand the Bible. He is to be found in every page; every book of the Old Testament points to the Lamb of God. Every book of the New Testament tells of Him.

Without question, the Bible is a closed book until one accepts the Lord Jesus. Infidels and unbelievers criticize the book, but they can't understand its meaning. Clarence Darrow read the Bible, underscored its verses, but denied its teachings; therefore, the spiritual meaning of the Bible was never open to him because he denied Christ, the Key to the Scriptures.

There is something further to be said: The Bible does not become alive and vital to the Christian until he sees Jesus on every page of it. When he reads of the ark built by Noah and the salvation from the flood accorded Noah and his family, he thinks of Christ who is our ark of safety.

When he reads of Abraham and the command from God to sacrifice his only son, he thinks at once of Jesus, God's only Son, who died for us on Calvary's tree.

When he reads of the Passover scene in Egypt, and the blood sprinkled on the doorposts, he is reminded of Christ and the cross.

Yes, the Bible lives for us when the face of Jesus is seen. He is the Key to the Scriptures.

See Him as the Capstone and King of Our Salvation

The capstone is the finishing stone of a building. Without the capstone the building is never complete.

Paul said, "We preach Christ crucified." Christ crucified, buried, and risen is the very apex of the tower of salvation.

For those who reject Jesus the capstone of salvation there is no hope. Peter speaks of it in 1 Peter 2:6-8.

The magnificent promises of God would not be worth the paper they are written on if Jesus had not died on the cross.

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Let Christ the King show Himself in your dailv life. Let others see that you are walking and talking with the Lord by your Bible reading, your prayer, and your worship. Let men know that you are on the side of the Lord by your consecrated walk and by your refusal to engage in things of sin.

He completed the glorious way of salvation. He finished the bridge from earth to Heaven.

In every realm of life man looks out for himself. He preaches and practices safety first, but here is one place where man utterly fails to see his own good and his terrible danger. Beware of the one who minimizes the message of Christ. Turn quickly from any church or denomination where the Saviour is not exalted as the one and only hope of salvation.

For you, sinner friend, all of your hopes of Heaven and salvation some day are nothing-if you reject Christ who is the chief cornerstone. Blood ancestry and good works are powerless to save you. You must have Christ. His blood must be applied to your soul.

My friend, if you refuse Christ, you will stumble over Him and hurt yourself. In return the Stone will roll upon you and grind you to powder. Hear Christ as He speaks: "And whosoever shall fall on this stone shall be broken: but on whomsoever it shall fall, it will grind him to powder."–Matt. 21:44.

In every realm of life man looks out for himself. He preaches and practices safety first, but here is one place where man utterly fails to see his own good and his terrible danger.

When Christ came to the world, His own received Him not. They rejected Him who came to be the head of the corner. The same condition holds true today. His will is not wanted, His way is not desired, and His words are not accepted. Christ does not fit into men's selfish plans. The self-centered building and planning of man cannot harmonize with the Chief Cornerstone. We preach Christ: The King of the Spheres, the Key to the Scriptures, and the Capstone of our Salvation. We preach Christ crucified because "without shedding of blood is no remission." We preach Christ, for "neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."

The world says, "Give us something else." We must answer, "There is nothing else. No one else save Christ can help you."

Isms, cults, and denominations cannot save a man-this is the work of our Christ.

The Eternal One is marching by this day. Will you take Him as your Saviour? I must testify that the only life of peace and joy is found in Him-the only way to Heaven is in the Son of God. **‡**





This morning George passed on ahead to Heaven to truly experience the forevermore part of the above-quoted promise.



I'll Never Get Used to Being USED

He had considered accepting Jesus before but did not think the Lord could use him with legs that did not work. am a family doctor who has traveled and served with GPA Mobilization Ministries on numerous occasions. In 2015, we were in Panama holding a medical clinic at the church of the missionary there when we were notified that someone needed medical care who was not able to get to the clinic. So, about six of us (including my 20-year-old

college daughter) piled into the missionary's van and traveled about 20 minutes to a small rudimentary "house" with dirt floors. Inside we were led to a boy of about 18 who had Muscular Dystrophy.

Despite all my flaws, He tapped ME on the shoulder and asked, "Dave, would you go for Me?" He could not walk and had not been out of his house for more than a year. He had some sores on his feet that we treated with medicine we had brought.

She reminded him about a Latin preacher who had no arms or legs that this boy knew about, and they agreed that he was a powerful voice for God despite his limitations and that all of us can be used in a mighty way to spread the Gospel. The boy agreed to accept Christ right then and there on his bed in his bedroom. The nurse then turned to me and asked me to pray for this boy's salvation while she interpreted in Spanish for him. So, there I was, so far from home, with my daughter holding one hand, and this boy's mother holding the other hand, praying for salvation while everyone there was crying.

Then the thought overwhelmed me that God, the Creator of the Universe, would ask ME to be His emissary to

that bedside. Despite all my flaws, He tapped ME on the shoulder and asked, "Dave, would you go for Me?" It was one of the most profound, impactful moments of my life. Because we were obedient (by going to Central America on His behalf), He showed us His face and used us (and me personally) in a mighty way in that room. This was beyond awesome. I am so blessed to be a blessing! **₽**



Burlington Revival Interview with CT Townsend

For years before this revival began (and even to this day) the pastor and men of the church were praying for revival in their church, state, and nation.

HOW DID LAST YEAR'S BURLINGTON REVIVAL BEGIN?

We began on Mother's Day evening, May 8, 2016, at New Hope Baptist Church with Pastor Randy Hobbs. One person was saved in that first week. There was a lot of brokenness and praying and people making things right with each other in and out of the church. There were some who even left the service to call and

make things right with someone over the phone. For years before this revival began (and even to this day) the pastor and men of the church were praying for revival in their church, state, and nation.

HOW WAS THE DECI-SION MADE TO RUN MULTIPLE WEEKS?

The last night of the first week of revival Pastor Hobbs stood with tears in his eyes and said he didn't believe God was done and wanted to continue revival. I tossed and turned all that night trying to figure what we should do. Ultimately I felt I would be in trouble with the Lord if I left after just one week. I called the pastor of the church where I was supposed to start the next Sunday and asked if he would let me out of my



commitment. He said, "If you were with me, I'd want you to stay, so you have my blessing."

The attendance grew from 300 people on the previous Friday to 700 people on Monday of the second week. During the second week, it really turned into a community outreach uniting local area pastors who wouldn't, typically, have even had a meal together. They mended their relationships and so did church members in the area. By the end of the second week, the church was as full as it could be with folks standing and sitting wherever they could.

AT WHAT POINT DID YOU DECIDE TO MOVE TO THE TENT?

One night people were still coming in, and there wasn't a place for them to sit or even stand because it was already so full. The decision was then made to move forward with finding a piece of property and getting a tent.

How many churches helped with the extended meeting under the tent?

Brother Hobbs called Brother Ralph Sexton, Jr. and asked to borrow his tent. Brother Ralph had never loaned his tent before, but he said he would. We held a meeting at a local Golden Corral with about sixty pastors to make the official decision to move to the tent. The money to make the move was raised in about five minutes.

From that point, the revival exploded. Two hundred men showed up to help put up the tent. People were even getting saved while helping to set up. One man, who helped put up the road signs to the new location, broke down weeping and said, "I'm not saved," and he trusted Christ right there.

HOW MANY PROFES-SIONS OF FAITH WERE MADE THROUGHOUT THE REVIVAL IN 2016?

We had the altar workers ask people what they needed when they walked the aisle, and if it was salvation they helped lead them to the Lord. The total number counted was 1,249, but only God knows the actual number. I believe it was many more.

GIVE US A SPECIFIC STORY FROM THE 2016 MEETINGS OF HOW GOD WORKED IN ONE LIFE.

One night several were getting saved. While I was preaching the congregation practically shut me down before my sermon was done as they responded and came down the aisle to get saved.

A mother in her 60s came to the altar and was crying. She kept seeing other mothers pray for their children, and those children were getting saved as a result. She prayed for her son who lived in Tampa. He



claimed he didn't even believe in God. His life was in shambles.

That night she bought a plane ticket for her son to come home. She didn't tell him why. She just told him to get on the plane and come home because she wanted to see him. She picked him up at the airport and still didn't tell him anything. She brought him to the meeting. When he realized what she had done, he sat in the back of the tent, arms folded, and angry. I preached on the blood of Jesus. At the end of the service, several were getting saved. I looked back and saw the man's arms begin to come uncrossed. He looked like he was holding on to the chair in front of him as hard as he could trying to stay where he was. He seemed to be ready to respond, so I said to a group of men that they needed to specifically pray for this man. Soon after, that forty-somethingyear-old man came and just fell onto the altar and got saved.

HAVE YOU MADE ANY SPECIAL PREPARA-TIONS FOR THE TENT MEETING THIS YEAR?

We are scheduled for two weeks. The 2017 revival begins on May 1st. The first Friday night the tent will be dedicated, and we are seeking all those pastors and people who supported this from the start to be a part of it. The second Friday night, May 12th, is our youth night.

DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIFIC PLANS FOR MULTIPLE WEEKS OF MEETINGS?

I have no current plans, but I didn't book any other meetings in May, in case it does go longer. Many in Burlington believe God still isn't done and will bring revival again. God doesn't repeat Himself, but He often exceeds Himself. I am looking forward to all of us assembling back together in May to see what God might have for bringing revival, whether it's in Burlington again or somewhere else. One man, who helped put up the road signs to the new location, broke down weeping and said, "I'm not saved," and he trusted Christ right there.

The Safe Place

- This Psalm is the praise of one whose hope is rooted in God. It is the exuberant song of faith. These are the words of one who has known in personal experience the shafts of unkindness and the cruel torments of life, and this is his testimony that in the midst of all, there is a "secret place" shadowed over by the hand of God.
- In these two verses, three things are evident. We see the PERSON of whom all these things are true, "HE that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High." We see, secondly, his POSITION, he "shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty." Thirdly, in verse two, his PROFESSION is stated, "I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in him will I trust."

I. THE SECRET PLACE, vs. 1

- This person "dwelleth," that is, sits with, abides. He is not a visitor, but he is perfectly at home with "the most High." If a man would know God, he must have intimate communion in the secret place with Him. "In the secret place" means literally a hiding place. In Psalm 31, it is the "secret of thy presence" where evil things cannot live.
- Now, what does the Psalmist say about that man? He describes his POSITION. He says, he "shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty." This is,

II. THE SACRED PRIVILEGE, vs. 1b

- This is an expression which implies great nearness. We must walk very close to a companion if we would have his shadow fall on us. Isaiah said He shall be "as the shadow of a great rock in a weary land." Solomon said, "I sat down under his shadow with great delight." "Sat down" indicates no desire to leave, but to abide there forever. It is he who chooses to "dwell in the secret place of the most High" who shall "abide under the shadow (protection) of the Almighty."
- "The most High" is the SUPREME ONE, the highest. "The Almighty" is the ALL-SUFFICIENT ONE, implying sustenance, strength, satisfaction, sufficiency. Undoubtedly this truth led the Psalmist to cry (17:8), "hide me under the shadow (protection) of thy wings." Blessed SHADOW! Blessed SATISFACTION! "I sat down under his shadow with great delight," with great pleasure. His great delight is the exuberance of joy expressed as "joy unspeakable and full of glory."

III. THE SUBSEQUENT PROFESSION, vs. 2

- "I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in him will I trust." The two active verb phrases "I will say" and "will I trust" are very important. Without this sincere affirmation, "I will say," and this strong assurance, "will I trust," this lovely Psalm collapses. To enjoy the blessings and privileges of the secret place, the door must swing on these two hinges: "I will say" and "in him will I trust." Let us view each of these phrases separately.
 - 1. "I will say of the Lord" Personal declaration

The Psalmist is bold to claim the Lord in this most intimate, personal testimonial. The Psalmist claims the Lord to be (1) HIS SANCTUARY, "He is my refuge." When I am weak, exhausted, or overpowered, I turn to Him. He then claims Him to be (2) HIS STRONGHOLD, he is "my fortress," my tower of defense. When we are unable to meet the impact of battle, He is our safe, quiet resting place. He then proclaims Him to be (3) HIS SOVEREIGN, "He is . . . my God." My heart shall possess Him. He makes a personal declaration, "I will say."

2. "In him will I trust" — Personal determination

The speaker ends this second verse with a resounding note of confidence. Here is the application of these words: ". . . in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength," (Isaiah 30:15) for "He only is my rock and my salvation: he is my defense; I shall not be moved," (Psalm 62:6).

The pressures of circumstances and forces of evil may combine to test our faith, but if we will "dwell in the secret place of the most High," God will embolden us to declare with Job of old, "Though he slay me, yet will I trust him," (Job 13:15).
